


How to Repair a Hair Clip with a Detached Spring

This guide will show you how to repair your hair clip by reattaching the spring.

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INTRODUCTION


If your favorite hair clip broke in half, use this guide to repair your hair clip by reattaching the spring. Repairing your hair clip will allow you to make the clip fully functional, reduce plastic waste, and wear your favorite hair clip again!




TOOLS:

- Small Chain Nose Pliers (1)
- Rubber Band (1)

Step 1 — How to Repair a Hair Clip with a Detached Spring






- Place the two pieces of the hair clip together.
- (i) The circles on the top of the clip should align.


Step 2






• Tie the rubber band around the hair clip to secure the pieces in place.

Step 3




 Insert the pin halfway into the circles on the top of the clip.

Step 4



 Place the spring next to the inserted pin with the two edges facing upwards.

Step 5



 Use the pliers to push the pin through the spring and remaining holes.

Step 6







Take the rubber band off and test the repair.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
